A trio of talented young lads from East Sussex, Wild Horse formed in 2013 when all three members were still pre-teens. Since then, they've released four albums and three EPs, making them musical veterans at the ripe-old age of 20.

On their fun new single 'Freaky Together', the band combines its youthful exuberance and playful sexual energy with an array of 1970's musical influences – delivering a new-fashioned afro-tastic funk vibe to the ears of a new breed of restless young pleasure seekers.

While the anthemic harmony top-line is an unashamedly straightforward booty call befitting of the Gen Z Tinder generation (*"everybody is on their phones, so won't you come and see me tonight... let's get down and dirty.... give it to me"*) the backing track of tight and punchy funk bass and wucka-wucka guitar oozes mature musical sophistication and straight-up club-worthy danceability.

A playful glimpse into the universe of fun-seeking male post-pubescence, 'Freaky Together' is an infectious pop-funk dance floor anthem for our time – performed with a wide smile and unquestionable aplomb, making it a sure-fire hit for a generation seeking respite from an all-too-serious world.
