

## **The Incurables – Back To Eloise**

Many people, regardless of their favorite genre, listen to Rap to wake up and/or pump up. I would wager a substantial number would switch up to The Incurables, after one spin off, "Back to Eloise," would switch up to this power-punk paced tune that is masterfully grounded in late 60s Rock n Roll.

The song builds in a 'Rock' ear pleasing way- up top with a harder rock sounding guitar, before it all inclusively, "bands up" and proceeds to a wide-open jam fest.

The guitars are insane, the bass a wonder and together with the drums, et.al, go forth with wild 60s R & R, with a taste of English, humpin' up a pace that can't be outrun!

The lyrics are fun, the chorus a true kick to the mind stick with a lead vocalist who eats the speed, adding tight harmonies.

The chorus is such a worthy add to both the style, sound and tude of the song adding to the incredibly entertaining song:
