Review: "Follow You"

With a healthy disregard for convention, and loose, unruly attitude and bravado, 'Follow You' encapsulates the punk rock ethos from its unstable introductory climb through to its unresolved departure.

Racing rhythms and overdriven, riffing power chords underpin a fantastic vocal track, which captures a fine balance between controlled expression and dispassionate indifference.

This superbly augments the thematic of the song, which fittingly express an imposition of will and a hell-bent desire to get one's own way, almost psychotic obsession.

To further enhance its swagger, the song bursts into manic bouts of guitar soloing, crashing cymbals and rolling drums, emanating an electrifying force, enough to drive any mosh pit into a frenzy.

The song is accompanied by an entertaining video, relatively simple yet strangely hypnotic as knee knee-high boots perform an alternatively choreographed conga line!
