Wild Horse are an East Essex based band out of Great Britain. This trio encompasses three young gentlemen between the ages of 19 and 21 who incorporate pop, classic rock, punk, reggae, blue-eyed soul, dirty funk, rap, Latin and so much more into their distinctive sound.

According to the band, their new song “Symphony of Broken Hearts” is a heartfelt ballad about the feelings of loss experienced after a breakup along with the anger and resentment that comes with it.

I, as a reviewer, could focus on the words and try to console Jack (lead singer) about his emotional state of mind when he wrote this tune; however, I won't do that. We all know how breakups can be hard but I as a crusty old rocker from Canada, say move on brother something better is just down the road. No doubt his emotional words will touch the hearts of people and that is what a song should do.

When listening to music, people soon recognize that certain compositions were written for a specific instrument. The strength of this song lies in the vocals. The instruments are there to support Jack's voice and not overpower the raw emotion of the tune. The lead singer's use of falsetto coupled with multi layers of vocal track during the chorus emphasizes the agony he is feeling about his situation. However, it also emphasizes the thought process the writer is going through as he struggles with the voices inside his head during a tumultuous time in his life. It is a very cool use of a multi vocal technique sometimes used by producer Mutt Lange.

Henry (Vocals, Guitar & Harmonica), Jack (Vocals & Guitar) and Ed (Drums), have their entire lives in front of them and if they continue writing songs the way they do; will have no partner troubles in the future.
